Council Report:

Meeting on Tuesday 18/07/23:

Financial position requires a rate increase of 10.2% but the decision was made to increase to 7.5% rate income. 2.9% increase on the rate. Only 1% community response to the sustainability plan regarding services required. Roads and rubbish are the main focus required by ratepayers. MMC investigating what community land is it required and the ability to maintain it.

URPS – master plan has been approved by MMC. Community sessions, one-on-one with business owners. 25/08/23 is end of the consultation period. Community consultation at Truro is planned to be on Wednesday 09/08/23.

Grant from Federal Govt regarding rectifying flood damage. MCC not funding clean up.

Survey in the rates booklet about best way to communicate with ratepayers.

Presentation: By Andrew Young

Directed to the TDCA and the ratepayers of Truro and Keyneton to discuss the future if our communities remain with MMC.

MMC is a large council area and is in financial crisis which is not due to flooding

Although our preference would be for it to be dual lane in both directions, we would rather it go ahead in a single lane format each way than not happen all together as this will be devastating for Truro"
